

Dear Sir/Madame,

I would like to inform you that from 8th to 10th of September 2022 in Kraków, we will be hosting a medical symposium – “Spinal oncology: multidisciplinary approach for complex care”, devoted to the multidisciplinary treatment of primary cancer and spinal metastases.

Our meeting is organized together by the Czech and Polish Society of Spine Surgery. We are currently in the process of obtaining the patronage of Oncological Societies. It will be the first symposium of that type in Poland and the second in Europe. To the aim of which will be to build multidisciplinary team that we believe in and will be able to meet the challenges of Innovative medicine and keep up with galloping progress in systemic treatment of cancer, radiation therapy and spine surgery.

Visible progress in the treatment of primary cancers gave the patients a chance to live longer and have an improved quality of life. Unfortunately, metastases to the bones and the spine which for some primary tumors may affect up to 40% of patients. These have always stood in the way of achieving a successful recovery. Metastases are a very serious threat to neurological efficiency; they also significantly reduce the quality of life of the affected patients.

Modern medicine and the progress of recent years allow us to be optimistic about the results of treatment, making sure that patients are provided with access to highly specialized treatment. This requires close and well-coordinated cooperation of specialists from several fields. These can be, but not limited to: oncologists, radiotherapists, radiologists, spine surgeons, neurologists etc. They all participate in the full therapeutic process of the patient, but as for today - not as a regular team; because in the bigger picture, they all work independently meaning that their work does not sufficiently benefit from the combination of an effort, knowledge and experience as well as the synergy of such a team in the qualification and in treatment of an oncological patient.


The main goal of the symposium that is happening in Kraków this year, is to create a platform where specialists can exchange their experiences, but also to help in the development of multi-specialist teams; as well as to show good models of cooperation that are already in existence. The first meeting dedicated to this challenge took place in Brno, Czech Republic, in 2021. It was attended by doctors from the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Ukraine and Poland. This year however, we would like to expand the meeting formula by inviting multi-specialist teams from all over Central Europe.

I would also like to add that in recent years the Polish Society of Spine Surgery has developed Polish guidelines for the qualification and treatment of spine tumors. It is also important to mention that regional cooperation – which we are a part of - allows us to gain unique experience and significantly improves the introduction of modern therapies. As the participation of specialists seems necessary to us in the created teams, on behalf of the Polish and Czech Spine Surgery Society, I would like to invite you to participate in our meeting.
